Project Hope of Gunnison Valley, a growing nonprofit serving those affected by relationship violence and sexual assault in Gunnison and Hinsdale Counties, is seeking an advocate with a passion for helping the Latino/a community.

Job Title: Latinx Advocate

Location: Gunnison, CO

Application Due: Friday, May 10th at 12pm

Hours: Part-time (20 hours/week). The position is hourly, non-exempt, with shifts on the 24/7 crisis-line on a rotating basis which could include some weekends and holidays.

Compensation: Pay is \$16/hr.

Citizenship Requirement: Must be legally allowed to work in the United States to apply.

Primary Duties: The Latinx Advocate serves as a support for those individuals who have experienced relationship violence and/or sexual assault. The Latinx Advocate works with both English and Spanish-speaking clients, providing them with resources, crisis intervention, safety planning, safe shelter placement, and other support services as needed. The Latinx Advocate will also attend outreach, prevention efforts, and community events for the Latino/a community. This position reports to the Advocacy Director.

Qualifications:

The following qualifications in education and experience are critical for a successful Latinx Advocate at Project Hope:

- Fluent in English and Spanish (written and verbal)
- Knowledge of the Latino/a culture and connections to the Latino/a community in Gunnison County
- Demonstrated ability to work collaboratively with people from diverse backgrounds and communities
- Strong interpersonal skills, humor, and compassion

- Outstanding administrative skills, including the ability to produce, track and manage data
- Excellent verbal and written communication skills

Educational Requirements: (ONE of the following):

- At least one year of experience in a nonprofit, social services or related setting working with Latino/a individuals in Spanish.
- A Bachelor's degree in public administration, social work, political science, Spanish or a related field.
- Any combination of education, experience and measurable performance that demonstrates the capability to perform the duties of this position successfully.
